AALEAD's Elementary Afterschool Program primarily serves low-income Asian American elementary school students between the ages of 5-13. The program operates onsite at Thomson and Bancroft Elementary schools Monday through Friday, from 3:30pm – 6:00pm beginning August 23rd and running through the end of the 2011-2012 academic year. Volunteer Program Aides report to the Elementary School Program Manager (Micah Shearer), and their individual site coordinators.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Assist in managing classroom behavior
- Tutor students individually or in groups
- Carry out specific tasks, as directed by the teacher, such as reading and writing assignments
- Provide assistance with vocabulary and grammar. Correct student pronunciation, spelling and syntax
- Assist teacher with sport, recreational, art, and extra curricular activities
- Notify AALEAD in advance when you are not available to volunteer

Time Commitment:

- Time commitment is flexible and can be anywhere from 2-10 hours served M-F during program hours.
